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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1289.31 of Title 21, unless
16	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. A firearm suppressor that is manufactured in this state and
18	remains in this state shall not be subject to federal law or federal
19	regulation including registration, under the authority of the United
20	States Congress to regulate interstate commerce.
21	1. A basic material from which a firearm suppressor is
22	manufactured in this state including unmachined steel, is not a
23	firearm suppressor and is not subject to federal regulation under
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the authority of the United States Congress to regulate interstate commerce as if it were a firearm suppressor.

- 2. A firearm suppressor manufactured and sold in this state must have the words "Made in Oklahoma" clearly stamped or engraved on it.
- B. For purposes of this section, a firearm suppressor is manufactured in this state if the item is manufactured:
 - 1. In this state from basic materials; and

- 2. Without the inclusion of any part imported from another state other than a generic and insignificant part.
- C. For purposes of this section, a firearm suppressor is manufactured in this state if it is manufactured without regard to whether a firearm imported into this state from another state is attached to or used in conjunction with the suppressor.
- D. No municipality or other political subdivision of the state shall adopt a rule, order, ordinance, or policy under which the entity enforces, or by consistent action allows the enforcement of a federal statute, order, rule, policy, or regulation that purports to regulate a firearm suppressor if the statute, order, rule, policy, or regulation imposes a prohibition, restriction, or other regulation that does not exist under the laws of this state.
- E. No person employed by or otherwise under the direction or control of a municipality or other political subdivision of the state shall enforce or attempt to enforce any federal statute,

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ordinance, rule, or regulation described by subsection B of this section.

- F. No municipality or political subdivision of the state shall receive state grant funds if the entity adopts a rule, order, ordinance, or policy under which the entity enforces a federal law described by subsection A of this section.
 - G. As used in this section:
- 1. "Firearm" shall have the same definition as provided in Sections 1289.3, 1289.4, and 1289.5 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 2. "Firearm suppressor" means any device designed, made or adapted to muffle the report of a firearm;
- 3. "Generic and insignificant part" means an item that has manufacturing or consumer product applications other than inclusion in a firearm suppressor. The term includes a spring, screw, nut, and pin; and
- 4. "Manufacture" includes forging, castling, machining, or another process for working a material.
- 19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
