- B. Prior to the installation or utilization of an advanced metering infrastructure (AMI), an electric service utility provider shall provide all customers with a document containing the following AMI disclosures:
- A list of possible benefits to the customer requesting an AMI meter;
- 2. A list of the amount and type of data collected by an AMI meter and the specific persons or entities with whom the data may be shared;
- 3. A copy of the report prepared by the Naval Medical Research Institute documenting the health side effects attributed to microwave and radio-frequency radiation; and
- 4. A statement explaining how in some instances AMI meters have overheated and ignited.
- C. Upon written request, an electric service utility provider shall provide a copy of the disclosure document required pursuant to subsection B of this section to a customer who is utilizing advanced metering infrastructure (AMI).

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D. No customer of an electric service utility provider shall be subject to any economic coercion or additional fine or penalty for not installing or utilizing an advanced metering infrastructure (AMI). The provisions of this section shall apply to residential, industrial and commercial customers of any electric service utility

provider.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
