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7	An Act relating to workforce development; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.10d, which relates to a
8	Governor's Council for Workforce and Economic Development; modifying membership of Council;
9	modifying references to federal statutory provisions; modifying references to certain entity created
10	pursuant to executive order; modifying authority for additional appointments; providing for subcommittee
11	on Health Workforce; stating purpose; prescribing duties; and providing an effective date.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 5003.10d, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 5003.10d A. The Governor's Council for Workforce and
19	Economic Development established under the authority of Executive
20	Order 2005-27 is hereby recognized by the Legislature as the State's
21	Workforce Investment Board. The Council succeeded and was
22	established in lieu of the Oklahoma Workforce Investment Board.
23	Appointed members of the Council serving under the authority of
24	Executive Order 2005-27 when this act becomes effective shall

continue to serve until their terms have expired and their
 successors have been duly appointed.

3 Pursuant to the federal Workforce Investment Innovation and 4 <u>Opportunity</u> Act, the purpose of the Council shall be to: 5 1. Guide the development of a comprehensive and coordinated 6 workforce development system for the state and monitor its 7 operation; and

8 2. Review and make recommendations that will align the 9 workforce system, including education, with the economic development 10 goals of the state for the purpose of creating workforce and 11 economic development systems that are integrated and shall provide 12 Oklahoma a competitive advantage in a global economy.

13 в. Membership of the Council shall include representatives of 14 private employers who reflect Oklahoma's projected and desired 15 business and industry base and public officials from agencies which 16 provide programs and services related to workforce, education and 17 economic development. All Council members shall be in positions to 18 influence policy and hiring decisions within their organizations. 19 Initial appointments to the Council shall conform to the following 20 described schedule:

21 1. <u>The membership of the Council shall comply with the federal</u> 22 requirements of the state investment board;

23 <u>2.</u> A majority of the Council shall come from described private
 24 sector employers, including: owners of businesses, chief executives

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1	or operating officers of businesses, or other business executives or
2	employers with optimum policymaking or hiring authority, and who
3	represent businesses (including small businesses) that provide
4	employment opportunities that at a minimum include high-quality,
5	work-relevant training and development in in-demand industry sectors
6	or occupations in the state;
7	$\frac{2}{2}$. State officials shall include incumbents or designees of
8	the following named offices, or their successors in office or
9	function:
10	a. Governor,
11	b. two members <u>one member</u> of the Senate, appointed by the
12	President Pro Tempore,
13	c. two members <u>one member</u> of the House of
14	Representatives, appointed by the Speaker,
15	d. Secretary the Executive Director of the Oklahoma
16	Department of Commerce and Tourism, and
17	e. Secretary of Education,
18	f. Secretary of Human Services,
19	g. Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
20	Education,
21	h. Director of Career and Technology Education,
22	i. State Superintendent of Public Instruction,
23	j. <u>the</u> Executive Director of the Oklahoma Employment
24	Security Commission , and

1	k. Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation
2	Services,
3	3. Two members from organizations with experience in the
4	delivery of workforce services, including community colleges or
5	other community-based workforce service organizations;
6	4. Two members from organizations or individuals that have
7	experience with respect to youth activities;
8	5. Two members that are chief elected officials from a city and
9	county;
10	6. Two members that represent labor organizations; and
11	7. Additional members, at the discretion and pleasure of the
12	Governor, may be appointed representing÷
13	a. local welfare agencies,
14	b. public housing agencies,
15	c. administrators of programs which receive federal or
16	state human resources funding,
17	d. representative of a Local Workforce Board Chairs
18	Association,
19	e. entities with special knowledge and qualifications
20	regarding special educational and career development
21	needs of hard-to-serve individuals,
22	f. state and local economic development representatives,
23	g. juvenile justice programs,
24	h. state human resources organization,

2 and transportation, 3 j. state organization representing urban rural hospitals, 4 k. representatives of Oklahoma Tribes or Nations, and 5 i. representatives of minorities in Oklahoma the needs or 6 interests of the state economy or specific regional 7 needs; and 8 5. Ex officio members, at the discretion and pleasure of the 9 Governor, may be included to provide expertise and agency 10 information to the Council. These seats may include, but not be 11 limited to: 12 a. the Secretary of Education, 13 b. the Secretary of Commerce, 14 c. the Secretary of Health and Human Services, 15 d. the Chancellor of the Oklahoma State Regents for 16 Higher Education, 17 e. the Director of Career and Technology Education, 18 f. the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, 19 g. the Director of the State Department of Rehabilitation 20 services, 21 h. the Director of the Oklahoma Department of 22 corrections, 23 i. the Commissioner of the Oklahoma Department of Mental<	1	i.	representatives of tourism, agriculture, corrections

4 С. Private sector members shall be appointed by and serve at 5 the pleasure of the Governor for a two-year term beginning October 1, 2005, and may be reappointed. However, of the initial private 6 7 sector members appointed, half shall be appointed for an initial term of one (1) year beginning October 1, 2005. Private members may 8 9 be removed from office for failure to attend three consecutive 10 Council meetings. The chair of the Council shall be from the 11 private sector and shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure 12 of the Governor.

13 D. The Council shall meet at such times and places as it deems 14 appropriate. Members shall serve without compensation. Council 15 members employed by a state agency shall be reimbursed travel 16 expenses related to their service on the Council as authorized by 17 state law by their respective state agency. Legislative members of 18 the Council shall be reimbursed by their respective houses for 19 necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their 20 duties as authorized by state law. Remaining Council members shall 21 also be reimbursed travel expenses related to their service on the 22 Council by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce as authorized by 23 state law. No member of the Council shall profit, directly or 24 indirectly, from any transaction with the Council.

E. The duties and responsibilities of the Council in the
 development, monitoring and aligning of the workforce system with
 economic development shall include, but not be limited to:

Performing the duties required of the state governance board
 by the federal Workforce Investment <u>Innovation and Opportunity</u> Act;

2. Identifying the human resource investment needs of Oklahoma
business and industry, together with those of the citizens of the
state, so that each might respond to and meet the needs of the
others and thus together build a robust, diversified economy;

10 3. Reviewing and evaluating workforce development programs 11 within the state, formulate recommendations to increase their 12 efficiency and effectiveness, eliminate duplication, and align with 13 economic goals. Recommendations shall be communicated to the 14 Governor, Legislature, state and federal government agencies and 15 appropriate individuals and entities within the private sector;

16 4. Increasing academic capability and technical skills within 17 the state workforce and foster lifelong learning among Oklahoma's 18 citizens;

19 5. Strengthening collaboration among institutions which provide 20 education and training services, government agencies which 21 coordinate employment and other human resource investment 22 activities, and Oklahoma business and industry to create a seamless 23 system to nurture healthy economic development; and

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6. Enhancing rural economic development capability and
 capacity, giving particular attention to regional collaboration and
 partnering.

F. Activities of the Council shall be coordinated by the
Secretary of Commerce and Tourism and directed by the Deputy
Secretary of Commerce for Workforce Development, or their successors
in office or function. Administrative and staffing support for the
Council shall be coordinated by the Office of Workforce Solutions
within the Department of Commerce.

10 G. The State Workforce Solutions Staff Team Partners originally 11 established under the authority of Executive Order 2005-27 as the 12 Workforce Solutions Staff Team is hereby recognized by the 13 Legislature. This interagency team shall be comprised of executive 14 level staff from all workforce, education and economic development 15 agencies of the state for the purpose of providing staff support to 16 the Council and to create efficiencies, eliminate duplication, and 17 eliminate barriers to jointly providing a service delivery system. 18 Other members may be included on this team as the Governor τ 19 Secretary of Commerce or Deputy Secretary of Commerce may deem 20 necessary to accomplish this goal.

H. The Council shall be supported by funds available to state agencies pursuant to state and federal laws and regulations. Each member of the Council whose agency qualifies pursuant to state and federal law to receive and use such funds shall assist by providing

1	support and funding of the Council in carrying out the
2	responsibilities of the Council.
3	I. The Council shall form a subcommittee on Health Workforce
4	whose purpose shall be to inform, coordinate and facilitate
5	statewide efforts to ensure that a well-trained, adequately
6	distributed and flexible health workforce is available to meet the
7	needs of an efficient and effective health care system in Oklahoma.
8	Duties of the Health Workforce Subcommittee shall include, but not
9	be limited to, the following:
10	1. Conducting data analysis and preparing reports on health
11	workforce supply and demand;
12	2. Research and analysis of state health professional education
13	and training capacity;
14	3. Recommend recruitment and retention strategies for areas
15	determined by the Oklahoma Primary Care Office or the Oklahoma
16	Office of Rural Health to be areas of high need; and
17	4. Assessment of health workforce policy, evaluation of the
18	impact on Oklahoma's health system and health outcomes and
19	developing health workforce policy recommendations.
20	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
