14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:									
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2011, Section 12-1, is									
16	amended to read as follows:									
17	Section 12-1. A. The State <u>Oklahoma</u> Department of Agriculture,									
18	Food, and Forestry shall enter into a written agreement on behalf of									
19	the State of Oklahoma with the <u>United States Department of</u>									
20	Agriculture Wildlife Services, Animal and Plant Health Inspection									
21	Service, United States Department of Agriculture. The agreement									
22	shall be for the purpose of cooperating with Wildlife Services $_{m au}$									
23	United States Department of Agriculture, in conducting wildlife									
24	damage management for beavers, coyotes, bobcats, feral swine, and									

1 other wildlife <u>or invasive</u> species causing destruction to livestock, 2 poultry, crops, range land, forests, and other resources, including 3 human health and safety.

Wildlife damage management of predatory animals and other 4 Β. 5 wildlife species causing damage shall include but not be limited to hunting, trapping, or other practical methods for the control of 6 7 wildlife damage to resources. Operations shall be directly 8 supervised by the United States Department of Agriculture Wildlife 9 Services in association with the Department. The Department is 10 authorized to enter into cooperative agreements with counties, 11 associations, corporations, and individuals for hunting and trapping 12 operations and control of wildlife damage.

13 С. In cooperation with Wildlife Services, the Department is 14 authorized to purchase wildlife animal damage management supplies, 15 including but not limited to bait, for cooperating governmental 16 agencies, counties, associations, corporations, and individuals for 17 the control of damage caused by predatory animals and other wildlife 18 species. The Department shall make these supplies and baits 19 available to cooperators at approximate cost. The receipts from the 20 sale of supplies and baits shall be credited to the State Department 21 of Agriculture Revolving Fund.

D. Furs, skins, and specimens or other parts or byproducts of
<u>commercial value</u> collected by wildlife services <u>Wildlife Services</u>
agents shall be sold upon sealed bids after advertisement of the

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sales, as prescribed by the Department. The proceeds of all sales 1 shall be credited to the State Department of Agriculture Revolving 2 Fund. Any specimen may be presented, free of charge, to any state 3 4 institution subject to the jurisdiction and control of the State of 5 Oklahoma. No bounty shall be collected from any source for predatory animals and wildlife taken by wildlife services Wildlife 6 7 Services agents operating pursuant to a cooperative agreement. 2 O.S. 2011, Section 12-2, is SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 8 9 amended to read as follows: 10 Section 12-2. It shall be lawful for an authorized agent of the 11 State Board of Agriculture engaged in wildlife damage management, 12 pursuant to the provisions of Section 12-1 of this title, to carry $\frac{1}{2}$ 13 clip-loaded or magazine-loaded rifle or shotgun in a vehicle, 14 provided the rifle or shotgun is not chamber-loaded firearms in the 15 course of his or her official duties. Authorized agents shall 16 successfully pass a background check by the Oklahoma Department of 17 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry and be trained in accordance with 18 United States Department of Agriculture Wildlife Services guidelines 19 for the use of firearms in wildlife damage management. 20 The names of agents authorized by the Board to carry a rifle and 21 shotqun firearms shall be furnished to the Oklahoma Department of 22 Public Safety. 23 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017. 24
