A. Every person who, without justifiable or 18 excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any 19 20 assault, battery or assault and battery upon the person of an emergency a medical care provider who is performing medical care 21 duties, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony misdemeanor 22 23 punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections county jail for a term not exceeding two (2) years one 24

1 (1) year, or by a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars
2 (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

- B. As used in this section, "emergency medical care provider" means doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, laboratory technicians, radiological technologists, medical students, physical therapists, physician assistants, chaplains and members of a hospital security force.
- SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 650.5, is amended to read as follows:
 - Section 650.5. A. Every person who, without justifiable or excusable cause and with intent to do bodily harm, commits any aggravated assault and battery or any assault with a firearm or other deadly weapon upon the person of an emergency medical technician or other emergency a medical care provider who is performing medical care duties, upon conviction, is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in a state correctional institution for not more than one (1) year two (2) years, or by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- B. As used in this section, "medical care provider" means

 doctors, residents, interns, nurses, nurses' aides, ambulance

 attendants and operators, paramedics, emergency medical technicians,

 laboratory technicians, radiological technologists, medical

3	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
