## A-Engrossed House Bill 4035

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Allows corrections officer employed by Department of Corrections to lawfully possess [weapon] firearm in locked [gun box] trunk, glove compartment, center console or other container in officer's personal vehicle when vehicle is parked in department parking lot and officer is present at department in official capacity.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to possession of a weapon by a corrections officer; and declaring an emergency.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2014 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 166.360 to
5	166.380.
6	SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any Department of Corrections regulation, rule, policy or
7	provision of an employment contract to the contrary, a corrections officer as defined in ORS
8	181.610 who is employed by the Department of Corrections may possess a firearm in the
9	officer's personal vehicle when the vehicle is parked in a department parking lot if the offi-
10	cer:
11	(1) Is present in the officer's official capacity at a public building occupied by the de-
12	partment;
13	(2) Has a valid concealed handgun license issued pursuant to ORS 166.291 and 166.292; and

SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2014 Act applies to employment contracts entered into or renewed on or after the effective date of this 2014 Act.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect on its passage.
