SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Provides that used firearm transfer register may be electronic or manual. Requires register approval by Department of State Police. Requires person using electronic register to provide hard copy of transaction information to federal law enforcement agency within specified time upon request.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 166.427 is amended to read:

166.427. (1) Whenever a person engaged in the business, as defined in 18 U.S.C. 921, of selling, 5 6 leasing or otherwise transferring a firearm, whether the person is a retail dealer, pawnbroker or 7 otherwise, buys or accepts in trade[,] a used firearm, the person shall enter in a register the time, date and place of purchase or trade, the name of the person selling or trading the firearm, the 8 9 number of the identification documentation presented by the person and the make, model and 10 manufacturer's number of the firearm. The register may be either electronic or manual and must be approved by the Department of State Police. [The] A manual register shall be obtained 11 from and furnished by the Department of State Police to the dealer on application at cost. 12 13 (2) The duplicate sheet of [the] a manual register shall, on the day of purchase or trade, be hand delivered or mailed to the local law enforcement authority. If the register is electronic and is 14

uploaded pursuant to a local ordinance to the local law enforcement agency, the person shall,
upon request, provide a hard copy of all transaction information described in subsection (1)

17 of this section to a federal law enforcement agency within 24 hours of the request.

(3) Violation of this section by any person engaged in the business of selling, leasing or other wise transferring a firearm is a Class C misdemeanor.
