## AN ACT

Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in 2 firearms and other dangerous articles, further providing for 3 limitation on the regulation of firearms and ammunition; and, in home rule and optional plan government, repealing 5 provisions relating to limitation on municipal powers. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 6120(a) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania 10 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to read: 11 12 § 6120. Limitation on the regulation of firearms and 13 ammunition. General rule. -- [No county, municipality or township] 14 Except as provided in subsection (a.4), no political subdivision 15 16 may in any manner regulate the lawful ownership, possession, transfer or transportation of firearms, ammunition or ammunition 17 18 components when carried or transported for purposes not

- 1 (a.4) Exception. -- A political subdivision may, by ordinance,
- 2 regulate the possession, transfer or transportation of firearms,
- 3 ammunition or ammunition components when carried or transported
- 4 on any property owned, operated or maintained by the political
