## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of November 22, 1978 (P.L.1166, No.274), entitled "An act establishing the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency, providing for its powers and duties establishing several advisory committees within the commission and providing for their powers and duties," further providing for Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency; and establishing the Mental Health and Justice Advisory Committee and the Mental Health and Justice Grant Program.
10	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11	hereby enacts as follows:
12	Section 1. Section 2(d)(2) of the act of November 22, 1978
13	(P.L.1166, No.274), referred to as the Pennsylvania Commission
14	on Crime and Delinquency Law, amended October 25, 2012
15	(P.L.1607, No.196), is amended and subsection (b) is amended by
16	adding a paragraph to read:
17	Section 2. Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency.

19	(b) CompositionThe commission shall consist of the
20	following members:

2	(17.3) Chairman of the Mental Health and Justice
3	Advisory Committee.

5	(d) Term of office

7	(2) The term of the [chairman] <u>chairmen</u> of the Juvenile
8	Justice and Delinquency Prevention Committee and the Mental
9	Health and Justice Advisory Committee shall be concurrent
10	with [his] <u>their</u> service as [chairman of that committee]
11	chairmen of their respective committees.

13	Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
14	Section 7.3. Mental Health and Justice Advisory Committee.
15	(a) EstablishmentThere is hereby established the Mental
16	Health and Justice Advisory Committee within the commission.
17	(b) CompositionThe members of the committee shall be
18	appointed by the Governor and shall include representatives of
19	the Department of Corrections, the Department of Drug and
20	Alcohol Programs, the Department of Military and Veterans
21	Affairs, the Office of Mental Health Services and Substance
22	Abuse Services of the Department of Human Services, the
23	Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, the Administrative
24	Office of Pennsylvania Courts, the Pennsylvania Commission on
25	Sentencing, units of local government, public and private
26	agencies and organizations which provide or advocate for mental
27	health treatment and services, agencies which provide housing
28	for the mentally ill, victim service agencies, drug and alcohol
29	treatment providers, police, district attorneys, public
30	defenders, judges of the courts of common pleas, county adult
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1	and juvenile probation officers, county wardens and any other
2	individuals with expertise in the public safety response and
3	management, treatment or provision of services to individuals
4	with mental illness involved in the juvenile justice or criminal
5	justice system.
6	(c) TermMembers shall serve for a four-year term and may
7	be appointed for no more than one additional consecutive term.
8	(d) Number and qualificationsThe committee shall consist
9	of no more than 33 members, all of whom must have experience in
10	the public safety response and management, treatment or
11	provision of services to individuals with mental illness
12	involved in the juvenile justice or criminal justice system.
13	(e) Conditions of appointmentThe committee and its
14	members are subject to the same limitations and conditions
15	imposed upon the commission as prescribed in section 2(d), (e),
16	(h), (i), (m) and (n).
17	(f) QuorumA majority of the members shall constitute a
18	quorum and a vote of the majority of the members present shall
19	be sufficient for all actions.
20	(g) ChairmanThe Governor shall appoint a chairman from
21	among the members of the committee who shall serve at the
22	pleasure of the Governor. A vice chairman shall be designated by
23	the chairman and preside at meetings in the absence of the
24	chairman. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairman,
25	<u>but not less than four times a year.</u>
26	(h) Powers and dutiesThe Mental Health and Justice
27	Advisory Committee shall have the power, and its duty shall be:
28	(1) To serve in an advisory capacity to the commission
29	through the committee's participation in the development of
30	that part of the commission's comprehensive plan relating to
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1	the provision of treatment and services to individuals with
2	mental illness involved in the juvenile justice and criminal
3	justice systems.
4	(2) To serve the commission in an advisory capacity
5	relating to the direct approval and disbursement of financial
6	assistance.
7	(3) To advise the commission on the definition,
8	development and correlation of programs and projects and the
9	establishment of priorities for the provision of treatment
10	and services to individuals with mental illness involved in
11	the juvenile justice and criminal justice systems.
12	(4) Upon request, to provide whatever assistance and
13	advice to the commission on any other matters relating to the
14	provision of treatment and services to individuals with
15	mental illness involved in the juvenile justice and criminal
16	justice systems.
17	(i) Resource and staff supportThe Department of Human
18	Services and the Department of Corrections shall cooperate with
19	the commission in providing resources to the commission in
20	support of the committee. Staff support shall be made available
21	to the committee by the executive director in order to
22	adequately perform the duties provided for in this section.
23	Section 8.2. Mental Health and Justice Grant Program.
24	(a) EstablishmentThere is hereby established the Mental
25	Health and Justice Grant Program within the commission.
26	(b) Awarding grantsThe commission shall award grants to
27	assist in planning, implementing or expanding initiatives that
28	increase public safety, avert increased spending on criminal
29	justice and improve the effectiveness of treatment services for
30	individuals with mental illnesses, substance abuse disorders or
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1 co-occurring mental health and substance abuse disorders who are
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2 <u>involved or at risk of involvement with the criminal justice</u>

- 3 <u>system.</u>
- 4 (c) Number of grants.--The commission shall base the number
- 5 of grants on the amount of funds appropriated by the General
- 6 Assembly and other funds available for the purposes of this\_
- 7 <u>section.</u>
- 8 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
