	Section 1. Section 53F-5-218 is enacted to read:
	53F-5-218. Outdoor recreation firearm safety curriculum pilot program.
	(1) As used in this section:
	(a) "Firearm" means the same as that term is defined in Section 76-10-501.
	(b) "Non-firing replica firearm" means a facsimile of a firearm that does not, and
can	not be modified to, expel a projectile by action of an explosive.
	(c) "On or about school premises" means the same as that term is defined in Section
<u>76-</u>	<u>10-505.5.</u>
	(d) "Outdoor recreation core standards" means the supplemental physical education
cor	e standards for outdoor recreation that the state board adopts.
	(e) "Participating LEA" means an LEA that the state board selects to participate in the
pilo	ot program.
	(f) "Participating student" means a student in grade 9, 10, 11, or 12 at a participating
<u>LE</u>	A who is enrolled in a course offered in the pilot program.
	(g) "Pilot program" means the pilot program created in Subsection (2).
	(h) "Qualified instructor" means an individual who:
	(i) meets the qualifications for instructing participating students that the state board
ado	opts under Subsection (10); and
	(ii) instructs participating students in the pilot program.
	(i) "Shooting range" means the same as that term is defined in Section 47-3-102.
	(2) There is created a three-year pilot program to provide a one semester, 0.5 credit
phy	vsical education course in the safe handling of firearms to a participating student in grade 9,
10,	11, or 12.
	(3) Before the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, a participating LEA shall:

57	(a) (i) select a provider to supply materials and curriculum for the pilot program; and
58	(ii) contract with the provider to supply materials and curriculum for the pilot program;
59	<u>or</u>
60	(b) develop curriculum for the pilot program.
61	(4) The curriculum described in Subsection (3):
62	(a) shall:
63	(i) meet the outdoor recreation core standards;
64	(ii) meet the criteria and standards for approving a hunter education course that the
65	Division of Wildlife Resources establishes under Section 23-19-11;
66	(iii) comply with Section 76-10-505.5, governing possession of a firearm on or about
67	school premises; and
68	(iv) provide instruction in:
69	(A) the rules of firearm safety;
70	(B) the basic operation of firearms, including handguns, shotguns, and rifles;
71	(C) marksmanship and accuracy;
72	(D) state laws governing firearms; and
73	(E) suicide prevention;
74	(b) may include the use of a non-firing replica firearm on or about school premises; and
75	(c) may not include the use of a firearm on or about school premises.
76	(5) (a) A participating student may not discharge a firearm unless the participating
77	student is accompanied by a qualified instructor at a shooting range.
78	(b) A qualified instructor may not discharge a firearm as part of the qualified
79	instructor's duties under this section, unless the qualified instructor discharges a firearm at a
80	shooting range.
81	(6) A participating LEA shall obtain prior written consent from the parent or guardian
82	of a participating student before the participating student may participate in the pilot program.
83	(7) If the Division of Wildlife Resources approves a participating LEA's curriculum
84	described in Subsection (3) as a division-approved hunter education course under Section
85	23-19-12, the participating LEA shall issue a certificate of completion under rules the Division
86	of Wildlife Resources establishes under Section 23-19-12.
87	(8) (a) An LEA may apply to the state board to participate in the pilot program.

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88	(b) The state board shall select up to three LEAs to participate in the pilot program.
89	(9) Subject to legislative appropriations, the state board shall award grants to
90	participating LEAs to:
91	(a) contract with a provider to supply materials and curriculum for the pilot program;
92	<u>or</u>
93	(b) develop curriculum and purchase materials for the pilot program.
94	(10) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act,
95	the state board shall make rules to implement the pilot program, including rules that:
96	(a) establish qualifications for instructors that deliver the curriculum described in
97	Subsection (3);
98	(b) establish application procedures;
99	(c) establish a formula to determine a participating LEA's grant amount under this
100	section; and
101	(d) permit a participating student to earn 0.5 elective credits for completing a course
102	offered by a participating LEA under this section.
