1 AN ACT relating to career-technical education; establishing 2 a merit career-technical education student scholarship 3 endowment fund and an expenditure account; providing 4 for future scholarships; providing funding 5 redistribution of federal coal lease bonus revenues; 6 providing for a task force to study and prepare plans for 7 implementation of a career-technical education student 8 scholarship program; providing an appropriation; and providing for effective dates. 9

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-16-1701 is created to read:

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7	(a) The merit career-technical education student
8	scholarship expenditure account is created to consist of
9	earnings from the career-technical education student
10	scholarship endowment fund established under W.S.

12	legislature to the expenditure account. Monies within the
13	expenditure account shall be continuously appropriated to
14	the state treasurer for distribution as prescribed by law.

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19	Section 2. W.S. 9-4-204(u) by creating a new
20	paragraph (viii), 9-4-601(b)(i)(intro), (iv)(intro) and by
21	creating a new paragraph (vi) and 21-16-1201 by creating a
22	new subsection (e) are amended to read:

Funds established; use thereof. 2 3 (u) Other funds defined as follows shall be 4 classified by the state auditor pursuant to subsections (s) 5 and (t) of this section: 6 7 (viii) Merit career-technical education student 8 scholarship endowment fund - to consist of funds 9 appropriated or designated to the fund by law, or by gift 10 from whatever source. In accordance with Article 15, 11 Section 20, of the Wyoming Constitution, monies within the 12 fund shall be inviolate and may be invested in the same 13 manner as other permanent funds of the state. Earnings from 14 investment of monies within the fund shall be distributed 15 and expended as provided by law. 16 17 9-4-601. Distribution and use; funds, accounts, 18 cities and towns benefited; exception for bonus payments. 19 20 (b) The state treasurer shall ascertain and withhold 21 all bonus payments received from the federal government

attributable to coal, oil shale or geothermal leases of

federal land within Wyoming and shall distribute it as 1 2 follows: 3 4 (i) Except as provided by paragraph (vi) of this subsection, fifty percent (50%), the first seven million 5 five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00) of which 6 shall be distributed as follows, and any amount in excess 7 8 of million five hundred thousand dollars seven 9 (\$7,500,000.00) per year shall be deposited into the school 10 capital construction account established under W.S. 11 21-15-111(a)(i): 12 13 (iv) And except as provided by paragraph (vi) of 14 this subsection: 15 16 (vi) Effective July 1, 2015, and until such time 17 as one hundred twenty-five million dollars (\$125,000,000.00) has been ascertained and withheld under 18 19 this paragraph, and notwithstanding paragraphs (i) and (iv) 20 of this subsection, one hundred percent (100%) of the first 21 one hundred twenty-five million dollars (\$125,000,000.00) shall be deposited into the merit career-technical 22 23 education student scholarship endowment fund established

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1 under W.S. 9-4-204(u)(viii). Thereafter, all amounts in
2 excess of one hundred twenty-five million dollars

3 (\$125,000,000.00) ascertained and withheld under this

4 paragraph shall be distributed in accordance with

5 paragraphs (i) and (iv) of this subsection.

13 (e) In addition to the endowment funds established 14 under subsections (a) and (b) of this section, the merit 15 career-technical education student scholarship endowment 16 fund is established as provided in W.S. 9-4-204(u)(viii). Commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, 17 earnings from the merit career-technical education student 18 scholarship endowment fund established under this 19 20 subsection shall be transferred by the state treasurer to 21 the merit career-technical education student scholarship 22 expenditure account created by W.S. 21-16-1701.

1 Section 3. 2 (a) There is created a task force on merit career-3 4 technical education scholarships to consist of two (2) members of the Wyoming house of representatives, appointed 5 by the speaker of the house, and two (2) members of the 6 Wyoming senate, appointed by the president of the senate, 7 together with the following members appointed by the 8 9 governor: 10 11 (i) One (1) representative of community 12 colleges; 13 14 (ii) One (1) representative of private careertechnical education institutions operating in Wyoming; 15 16 17 (iii) Two (2) representatives from business and 18 industry; 19 20 (iv) One (1) representative of the public at-21 large; 22

1 (v) One (1) representative from the Wyoming 2 public schools career-technical education community; 3 4 (vi) One (1) representative from the Wyoming 5 department of education career-technical education program; 6 7 (vii) One (1) member of the state board of 8 education. 9 10 (b) The task force shall study the establishment of a 11 student merit career-technical education scholarship 12 program to be funded by the earnings from the merit careertechnical education student scholarship account created by 13 this act. The goal of the task force shall be to make 14 15 recommendations to the Wyoming legislature for future 16 legislation necessary for a student merit career-technical 17 education scholarship program to make career-technical 18 education post secondary programs in Wyoming as free as 19 possible to Wyoming high school graduates. The task force 20 shall consider and make recommendations as to the 21 following:

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institutions;

1 (i) The amount of tuition, fees and other 2 education related payments which can be sustained from 3 anticipated earnings from the merit career-technical 4 education student scholarship account; 5 (ii) Career-technical institutions to be 6 eligible for student scholarships awarded under this act, 7 8 including public and private institutions, with consideration given to any constitutional limitations 9 10 governing the expenditure of public funds for scholarship 11 purposes; 12 (iii) Scholarship qualification requirements and 13 requirements to maintain a scholarship including 14 15 consideration of high school course completion 16 requirements, performance levels on high school assessments and post secondary entry examinations, and academic 17 progress requirements for scholarship eligibility 18 19 maintenance; 20 (iv) Reentry requirements for students failing 21

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to maintain eligibility requirements of post secondary

2 (v) Waiver provisions, if any, regarding any of

3 the entry or continuing scholarship requirements;

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5 (vi) Administrative oversight of the program;

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(vii) An implementation date for the program; 7

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(viii) Additional funding for the program. 9

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In addition to subsection (b) of this section, (C) the recommendation of the task force shall include a requirement that the department of education collect such 13 14 information from school districts, Wyoming community 15 colleges and technical schools operating in this state, as 16 determined necessary by the department of work force 17 services to evaluate the impacts of the scholarship program created under this act on state employment and wages. 18 19 evaluation by the department of work force services shall 20 based upon studied control groups of program 21 participants and nonparticipants and shall be reported annually to the joint appropriations and education interim 22 committees, identifying program participants and student 23

1 control groups. The report shall also identify the return

2 on investment of the scholarship program, improve student

3 career counseling and incorporate representative employer

4 assessment of the skills competency of program and control

5 participants.

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7 (d) The task force may retain consultants as

8 necessary to fulfill its duties under this act. The task

9 force shall be staffed by the legislative service office.

10 State agencies shall provide information to the task force

11 as requested in order to fulfill its duties. The

12 legislative members of the task force shall receive

13 compensation, per diem and travel expenses in the manner

14 and amount prescribed by W.S. 28-5-101. Task force members

15 who are not legislators and are not state employees shall

16 not receive salaries, but shall receive the per diem and

17 mileage paid members of the Wyoming legislature under W.S.

18 28-5-101 for each day of actual task force meetings and

19 travel to those meetings.

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21 (e) The task force shall report its initial findings

22 and recommendations to the governor, the joint

- 1 appropriations and education interim committees by November
- 2 1, 2015.

- 4 (f) This task force shall cease to exist on March 31,
- 5 2016.

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- 7 **Section 4.** There is appropriated from the general
- 8 fund to the legislative service office fifty thousand
- 9 dollars (\$50,000.00) or as much thereof as is necessary to
- 10 fund the merit career-technical education student
- 11 scholarship task force in carrying out its duties under
- 12 this act. Prior to making any distribution to the merit
- 13 career-technical education student scholarship endowment
- 14 fund account pursuant to W.S. 9-4-601(b)(vi) as created by
- 15 section 2 of this act, the state treasurer shall first
- 16 deposit to the general fund fifty thousand dollars
- 17 (\$50,000.00) from those funds as repayment of this
- 18 appropriation.

- 22 (a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this
- 23 section, this act is effective July 1, 2015.

2 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section,

3 sections 3 and 4 of this act are effective immediately upon

4 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

5 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

6 Constitution.
